HURRICANE HARVEY COMES CLOSE AUGUST BEGONIA MEETING CANCELLED

With Hurricane Harvey threatening the coast of Texas President Doug Byrom agreed that the Austin Area Begonia Society Branch should cancel the Sunday, August 27th meeting in Zilker Botanical Garden Conservancy.

On Friday Harvey made landfall at Rockport, just north of Corpus Christi with winds of 150 miles per hour and then bringing sound and fury to Central Texas with torrential downpours and strange winds in Austin reaching 45 miles per hour at times. The new begonia garden planted before an eclipse was soaked and shaken.

BEGONIAS, TRES BIEN PRE-CONVENTION TOUR

The attendees of "Begonias, Tres Bien!" can enjoy a tour Tuesday, April 3, to the Burden Museum and Gardens — one of the best small museums in the United States of America. Located in the heart of Baton Rouge with Interstate 10 passing through the middle of the 410 acres of woods and fields, this is home to LSU Rural Life Museum and Windrush Gardens. Statuary from western Europe graces vistas and nooks amid all types of Louisiana tropicals, flowers, and trees. The Rural Life Museum contains buildings, antiquities, and artifacts moved from St. James Parish near New Orleans as well as other plantations dated from 1836. In addition to these sites the property also holds LSU Agricultural Extension with a Children's Garden, Herb and Rose Gardens, and AAS Test Garden. A Rural Life docent will guide visitors to all of the interesting areas, even past a Longhorn steer and the lake to enjoy lunch under the oaks at midday.

She was born on April 8, 1951, and developed an interest in begonias, sewing, and hybridizing. Her Begonia 'Oketa' is only one of the examples of her extraordinary talents.

NEW REGISTRATIONS OF BEGONIAS FROM PRISCILLA PURINTON

Number 1022 *Begonia grandis* 'Fan Xing' is a tuberous begonia with green with red tinge bulbils produced in the leaf axils, ovate leaves are deep green with white spots, undersurface of the leaves is deep red. Expect the cultivar to be available in one to 2 years.

Number 1023 Begonia ningmingensis 'Ningming Silver' is a rhizomatous begonia with pink or green petioles with shaggy white hairs. The upper surfaces of the hairy leaf blades are greenish white to almost completely white.



Mary Weinberg, an artist, has drawn these begonia leaves to show the difference between several plants especially B. 'Gigi' that had been called B. 'Curley Zee Bowman.' B. 'Gigi' is a sport of B. 'Sir Percy.' It is rhizomatous, with entire-subentire medium-sized

green leaves and an olive-green irregular border that breaks occasionally into the silver area; surface and underside of the leaf are sparsely covered with hairs; underside is dark red; peduncles are light green with sparse hairs.


B. 'Zee Bowman'

B. 'Zee Bowman' is a *b. bowerae* seedling It is rhizomatous with medium-sized lobed leaves of emerald green, with irregular silver areas surrounding and over the veins and sparse short white hairs on the upper surface and edges of the leaves. Undersides are light green with red veins. Peduncles are tan with red striate markings, and are sparsely haired.
