Hybridizer Don Asmussen hailed from Corpus Christi, Texas. His greenhouse operation was named "Raising Cane" Begonias, and his wife Billee assisted in his work. Some of their canes had names such as 'Ebony,' 'Chameleon,' 'Kandy Kisses,' 'Second Hand Rose,' 'Angel Wings,' 'Evee-Bee,' 'La Paloma,' and 'Cotton Candy.' — Remember that Jim Georgusis also has B. 'Jim's Cotton Candy,' a cane that originated in Louisiana.

SOME BEGONIAS CAN FOOL YOU

During one of the Austin Begonia sales, a lady wanted to swap some begonia cuttings for some that were for sale. Doug pushed 2 begonia cuttings to me.

They are growing and I described one as being black. A member of our group wanted to see the plant. At home I picked up the beautiful begonia that now was green with white flowers. While reading Mark C. Tebbit's *Begonias*, I came across an experiment first conducted by Jacques Jangoux of Brazil. When one side of a leaf was kept in full sunlight it was brownish green. When a thick cardboard was held over it, the leaf turned green. This change is reversible due to microscopic disc-shaped chloroplasts switching their orientation from a vertical to a horizontal position and back to a vertical position as the sunlight increases.



B. solimutata - Smith & Wasshausen 1977 Shrub-like

This experiment came as a result of a plant named B. *solimutata*, a new species native to the Rio Grongogy Basin in the Brazilian state of Bahia.



B. U003 - Burle Marx 1981 Shrub-like

This begonia was already grown in the United States by the American Begonia Society as an unidentified species code U003. It is also sold as B. *glaziovii*. Hybrids include B. 'Jabberwocky,' B. 'Midnight Sun', B. 'Orococo' and B. 'Spellbound'. B. *acida* is a relative, a species that prefers high temperatures and plenty of moisture.
