Judges Training

Waco Iris Society hosted a very successful Judges Training on February 16. The class was for 1 credit hour of Ethics training and 2 credit hours of Awards and Ballots. Both subjects are required before a candidate is able to progress to official judge. I was the instructor for the classes. Eleven attendees were WIS members, with a total of 16 attending the class and 7 taking the class for credit. I am especially happy to announce a new candidate application was submitted by Bill Calhoon. This is great news. I think Bill will make an excellent AIS Judge. I want to give a huge thank you to Bill and Phil, Glenn & Gloria and Preston for all the wonderful food. It was a huge feast and everyone really enjoyed it. No one left hungry.

I was able to attend another 2 hour Judges Training class on Feb. 17 in Dallas on Median Irises. Ginny Spoon from Winterberry Iris Garden in Virginia was the instructor.

While I am on the subject of AIS Judges, it is with much sadness to report that one of our Region 17 judges passed away March 2. Annette Brown of Denison, has been an AIS judge since about 2008. She was a big help to me while I was a candidate, giving me tutoring in her garden and helping me any way she could.

She will be missed.

Our show is scheduled earlier than usual this year due to the AIS Convention in Dallas. The show will be held on April 6 at the Clarion Hotel. To get us ready to show our irises, Glenn Huddleston will give us a program on Show Prep. Glenn & Gloria have a houseful of silver medals and Queen of Show ribbons, so they have had a great deal of practice in selecting the best specimens from their garden and getting them ready for the show bench. Glenn says the quest for Queen of Show is a year long project, starting with keeping his irises fertilized and weed free plus a little water if nature doesn't provide the needed rains. But 10 days prior to show time is when he starts to pay special attention to his bloomstalks. He will be telling us what to do for each of the 10 days leading up to the show and the final preparation before the specimen is placed on the show table. Come prepared to take lots of notes. If time allows, I may also do a quick Artistic Design demonstration if anyone needs a refresher. However. since we have my mentor and the
