Gardener's Gathering

Sorry for the last minute notification, but we just found out about this Monday. The Gardener's Gathering at the Carleen Bright Arboretum in Woodway will be held this Sunday, April 6. If you potted any irises last fall to sell at the iris show, bring them to the Gardener's Gathering this Sunday. Set-up is 10-12 and it opens to the public from 1-4. We will be at our

usual spot-straight ahead from the entrance where the road starts to circle around to the left. Call or e-mail me your list of plants so I can have photos of everything we have to sell. As usual, the sales will be a 50-50 share between the grower and the club. If you want money back, please attach a small strip of paper with your initials and the selling price. On your plants, have the name of the iris and the price marked in permanent marker. We usually try to put at least 3 rhizomes per pot and sell the pots for \$10 each or 3/\$25. The address is 1 Pavilion Way in Woodway. The easiest directions are to go South on Bosque from Hwy 6 until you come to the red light. The Arboretum is on the right.


