
Once again, welcome to a new Club year! As you know, the upcoming





meeting is one of the highlights for our Club with the annual iris giveaway, auction and exchange. This

be auctioned. The auction helps recover some of the money spent purchase the gift irises, so please do your part and bid on your favorites.



Meeting Minutes By Bill Calhoon, Secretary



Saturday, May 19, 2018, Vegas Buffet Restaurant, Waco, TX

Vice-President Ken Anderson called

the meeting to order at 11:10 a.m. and welcomed members and guests to the annual membership luncheon. Seventeen (17) members were in attendance, including new member Sylvia Lemley.

Following a break for the meal, Secretary Bill Calhoon conducted Roll Call and read the Minutes from the Saturday, March 17, 2018, meeting. After no additions or corrections from the floor, Preston Floyd moved to approve the minutes as read; Glenn Huddleston seconded the motion; the motion carried.

Bill Calhoon then conducted the AIS Membership Drawing which was won by Linda Barnard.

Treasurer Mitchell Whitley presented the Treasurer's Report. Balance of the account as of April 12 was \$9,944.83. After no additions or corrections from the floor, the Treasurer's Report was accepted as presented. Mitchell then announced that due to health reasons, he had relinquished the Treasurer's materials to WIS President Dan Cathey.

No other old business was introduced.

In New Business, Ken reiterated that at the March meeting, all current officers had agreed to continue for the next club year. In light of Mitchell's announcement, Peggy Cathey had agreed once again to be Assistant Treasurer, therefore Mitchell Whitley, Peggy Cathey, and Dan Cathey would be authorized signers on the Waco Iris Society club ac-

count. The following slate of officers was presented:

Secretary: Bill Calhoon

Ken then opened the floor to other nominations. There were no nominations from the floor. Glenn Huddleston then moved to accept the slate of officers as presented, including the addition of Peggy Cathey as Assistant Treasurer; Naomi Nabors seconded the motion; the motion carried.

Ken then reminded club members of the importance of completing the 2018 AIS Tall Bearded Iris Symposium Ballot, which is an opportunity for all AIS members to vote for up to 25 of their favorite Tall Bearded Iris. In her role as Region 17 President, Peggy is encouraging all eligible WIS club members to complete a ballot. Additional information, plus a PowerPoint presentation, was included in the email newsletter. Ken also had copies of the ballot available.

Ken then presented options for the 2019 Iris Show date. It was discussed and agreed that the second Saturday of April (April 13, 2019) would be the optimum date to hold the WIS show. Leroy Nabors moved to set the date for the 2019 WIS Iris Show and Sale to the second Saturday of April (April 13, 2019); Frances Peterson seconded; the motion carried. Ken then asked club members if they would like to use the same location as the 2018 show, indicating that Peggy had already discussed the possibility with the hotel; there were no objections to holding the 2019 show at the

same location (La Quinta Inn & Suites). Ken then asked for suggestions for a theme for the 2019 show. "The Holidays" or "Special Days/ Special Occasions" was suggested as a possible theme. Ken asked members to consider options and share suggestions.

Ken then opened discussion regarding the rhizome order for the Annual Giveaway, Exchange and Auction to be held at the September 2018 meeting. There was agreement to continue with orders from Superstition Iris Gardens and Mid-America Iris and to continue with \$300 orders from each location. Bob Alexander moved to place orders with Superstition and Mid-America for \$300 each; Leroy Nabors seconded; the motion carried.

Ken then presented the Show Report. In total, there were 107 entries, 95 cultivars, and 10 exhibitors in the 2018 show, which was an increase over previous years. Ken then presented the show awards and award certificates.


Following a suggestion that the date for the May 2019 annual luncheon be coordinated with Dan's and Peggy's schedules so that they could attend, no other new business was introduced.

Iris Exchange by Dan Cathey

Everyone has a chance to participate in the Iris Exchange each year. The purpose is to share increases of the iris you received in the Iris Giveaway 2 years prior (2016 this year). To the right is a list of members and the iris they received. We give you two years before bringing back an iris for the Exchange to give your plant time to increase. If, however, your Gift plant did not increase, or if it died, you may still participate in the exchange. Simply bring an iris introduced +/- 1 year from the one you received. If you did not receive an iris in 2016, you may participate by bringing an iris introduced within the past 6 years.

Perry Dyer

It was with great sadness to learn of the passing of Perry Dyer on September 3, 2018. Perry was from Oklahoma,

Region 22, but was a great friend to Region 17 as well. Perry was one of the judges for our 2015 Iris Show and our guest speaker and judges trainer when we hosted the 2016 Region 17 Meeting here in Waco.

Perry had a long history with irises and with AIS. Everyone speaks of his wealth of knowledge about all things iris. Perry became interested in irises when he was 10 and began hybridizing irises while in Jr. High School. In 1973, at age 18, he was the first recipient of the AIS Clark Cosgrove Youth Achievement Award. That same year, he also became the youngest AIS accredited judge. His first iris introduction was named for the local elderly lady who got him interested in irises originally, *Carrie Kolh*, released in 1977.

In 1979, he won the **Sass Medal** for his IB-*Silent Springs* and in 1980, the **Knowlton Medal** for his BB-*Soft Spoken*. He received the **Cook**-**Douglas Medal** for *Serenity Pray-*

er, an SDB and 2015, the **William Mohr Medal** for *Prince of Egypt*, an Arilbred median.

The AIS Board named him an Emeritus Judge in 2009 and also awarded him the AIS Distinguished Service Medal. In 2017, he received the Bennett C. Jones Award for Outstanding Median Hybridizing. Paul Black of Mid-

America Iris Gardens, introduced *Perry Dyer*, a median AB in honor of Perry in 2017.



He will be greatly missed.

Region 17 Meeting, 2017 by Peggy Cathey



The guest speaker and Judges Train-

ing Instructor did a super job of keeping us entertained and there was always food available.



WIS President, Dan Cathey, gave a report of how WIS is doing and Bill Pittman, Region 17 Membership Chair, presented Waco Iris Society with a **Region 17 AIS Silver Medal** certificate for having 75 % of our members as AIS members. Let's work hard in the coming year to be the first to win the **Platinum Medal** certificate for 100% AIS membership. Don't wait to win it, join now! Ask me how.



Members Do Well in Area Shows

One of the best things about growing irises is sharing them with others. We do this in our club many times throughout the year with club auctions, iris shows, and 2-3 sales per year, just to name a few. We all love to share the beauty of irises. When the time rolls around for our September sale, we want to share the best rhizomes we can with our friends, both old and new.

Up to two weeks before the sale, walk your garden and choose which irises need to be divided. Usually after three years, most clumps will be due. They start to become over crowded and won't bloom as well when the rhizomes start to crowd and crawl all over each other.



When you are ready to dig, take your list, a marker and some plastic bags into the garden and get busy. You may choose to dig just from the edges so as not to disturb the entire clump, or you may want to move the clump, therefore deciding



to dig it all. Lift the rhizomes gently with a spading fork or shovel, being sure you are digging irises from the clump you want. Sometimes, it can be difficult, but if the clumps are crowded, follow the rhizome back to the main "mother" rhizome if possible. Be sure to immediately write the name of the variety on a center leaf and put all into a plastic bag. Keep each variety in separate bags. Once they are all dug, find a shady spot and working with only one variety at a time, break the rhizomes apart so each

one has a nice size fan. Next, start to trim the leaves into an inverted V to about 6 inches. Grab the roots under the rhizome and trim them below your fist. Write the name of the variety on a **CENTER** leaf. Please do not write on an outside leaf or across multiple leaves. If you know the hybridizer and the year introduced, you may write that on a leaf as well. Be sure to price each rhizome. A pricing guide is attached. Remember, this is only a guide and is suggested for "bloom size" rhizomes. If you have a small rhizome, ask yourself "How much would I pay for this rhizome?" and price accordingly.

Once all your rhizomes are trimmed and labeled, mix up some water and bleach in a big tub. Use a 10% bleach to water ratio (1 c. bleach to 1 gal. water). Put a squirt of dish soap in as well. Let the rhizomes soak for about 10 minutes, then use a brush to scrub them up good and make them look pretty. Put into another tub of clear water to rinse

them off, then spread them out in a shady spot to dry.

Once all the rhizomes are good and dry, you may bag each variety separately or just put all the A's, B's, C's, etc. together. We are considering doing the sale a little different this year, much like how it was done at the August Region 17 Meeting. Each variety will be in it's own paper bag with a photo attached, so make this easy on yourself.



The most important thing about the whole process is to call or e-mail Peggy with a list of what irises you will have for the sale. Please send your list no later than the Thursday before the sale so I will have time to print any photos we don't have and to get them all pulled and put on the paper sacks. If there is no paper bag and photo of your irises, they probably will not sell. You may call your list in to 254-854-2558 or e-mail:

2018 American Iris Society Awards by Peggy Cathey

Each year, AIS Garden/Exhibition judges perform their most important task—casting their ballot for the



best irises. The results of the votes has recently been published. The winner of the 2018 Dykes Medal

Haunted Heart, by Keith Keppel, introduced in 2010.

Any variety of iris has a chance to become a Dykes Medal Winner. It must first receive an Honorable Mention award. After 2 years, it is then eligible to earn an Award of Merit. The next award must be the special award for whatever section it

belongs to, for example, a Tall Bearded iris must win a Wister Award (TB's are the only class of irises which awards 3 section awards each year). We are proud of



our friend hybridizer, and fellow Region 17 member, Tom Burseen for receiving a John

C. Wister Medal for his 2010 introduction: Notta Lemon. Tom also received Award of Merits for his TB's-Cow Patty, Dewuc Whatic, Gloriafied Glenn & Prissy Christy. We also have another friend, hybridizer and fellow WIS member who won an Award of Merit, congratulations to Hooker Nichols for

his LA. Watermelon Wizard. Tom received Honorable Mention awards for: Go Berserka, Spring Starter, Al's Gal, Sweetwater Pie Burns, Frozen Margarita, Walk that Walk, Decked Out and Ruby Baby. Hooker received Honorable Mention awards for his TB Honky Tonk Rumble and his Heartbreak Warfare Louisiana. Hooker also won the Franklin-Cook Cup for

Watermelon Wizard, Best Out of Region **Iris** at the 2018 National Convention in New Orleans. Congratula-



tions to these two great hybridizers. We are very proud to have them in our club and in Region 17.
