Preparations for Show by Ken Anderson, Show Chair

The spring iris show is always exciting. I remember the first time I visited a show and the first time I brought a horticultural entry. That is a story that will NOT be shared in this article. Let's just say it is a distant memory, and it is probably best left in the past. If you are bringing a horticultural entry for the first time, you might be concerned about the things you should do and the things you should not do. Just remember some basics. Get your entry cut late in the day on the evening before the show or early in the morning on the day of the show. Be sure to put the bloom stalk in water as soon as possible, even if it is not in the green bottle you will be using at the show. Be sure to label it correctly, especially if you are bringing more than one entry. And be sure you have a green bottle for each entry. At our last meeting, Mary Keeth did a wonderful job of sharing a lot of pointers

for show preparation of horticultural entries. If you are new at doing this, there will be plenty of other members to assist you in making sure your entry is properly exhibited. The same goes for any of you who might be entering the artistic division of the show. The best way to approach this is to just jump in and enter. The first time to enter might seem challenging, but once that experience is under your belt you will find a lot of pleasure in being a contributor to the show from this point forward.

I have tried to reach the contact person at the Hampton Inn to verify the time at which we might be able

to get into the show area on Friday afternoon. I know we will be able to get in there by 5:00 p.m., and it is likely they will let us in even earlier if there is not a function occurring in that room on Friday, April 7. However, at this time, I have not been able to get a response from the person in charge of reserving the room. If you really need to be there earlier than 5 o'clock on Friday, please feel free to contact me on Thursday, two days before the show. By then, I will have contacted the person by phone, email, or personal visit to the hotel. Call or text me at 254-223-3161.

For those members who are bringing potted irises, you can certainly drop them off at the hotel on Friday evening. However, if you live quite far from Waco and need to wait until Saturday to bring them, try to arrive around 8 o'clock. Check-in time for entries in the show will begin at 8:00 a.m. There is always a lot going on as entries are being checked in and placed on tables, and members entering the artistic division are busy preparing their designs. All displays and entries need to be in place by 9:45 a.m. The judges will be coming into the show area at 10:00 a.m. for instructions, and the judging will begin at 10:15.

Finally, I will repeat my usual speech regarding participation in the It is understandable that show. members want to bring the very best specimens they have and increase their chances of receiving blue ribbons on their entries. However, the public likes seeing color and the various combinations of colors. It is my opinion that all of the irises that bloom are worthy of appreciation. Last year we were worried about having enough irises to have a show. Remember, we have to have at least five exhibitors and at least twenty different cultivars to have an accredited show. Even if you have only one or two blooming on the day of the show, please bring them and help increase our number of exhibitors and cultivars.

For those of you who are bringing potted irises, you need to have a 1"x 4" strip of paper with your initials on it to receive the bonus from the sale. Please staple it securely to one of the leaves. (Please see page 13 of your Yearbook for information on sale tags.) It is very helpful if you use bright-colored paper (card stock works well), which helps with the sorting of tags for the person calculating bonuses. Also, be sure you have the variety of the iris marked clearly on the pot. All Pots should have at least two iris fans in them. If you have a pot with only 1, please hold it for an increase. All Pots will be \$10 each this year.

I am looking forward to seeing everyone at the show and really hoping to see a lot of beautiful irises.
