UPDATE ON NEW IRIS/DAYLILY/ROSE BED

Iris beds, November 14, 2023

The original plan when we dug the irises in July from the original beds located at the front of the garden was that we would be replanting them in October. That was delayed due to various events scheduled at Zilker including the Surreal Garden display. The last information was that one of the two new beds still needed to have soil added in November.

The Daylily Society requires 100 plants so they can meet the requirements for a national American Daylily Society Display Garden. We don't have to meet any such requirement and as we prefer 3 plants per clump, our estimation is we will need 50 to 60 varieties, which if we can't complete from the rhizomes from the July dig, we as members can hopefully provide. As we had some duplication in the old beds, I don't see a problem in having some duplication as one clump might not make and we mainly want to show what grows well in Central Texas.

The suggestion is still out there that the daylilies and irises will be planted in February and March which is not a good time for either flower. Plus considering past couple of years, there is always a good chance we could be having freezing weather in February.



Louisiana and Spuria beds, November 14, 2023

As everyone knows, we were told it was urgent that we dig the irises up in July as they had plans for the old beds. We still don't know what the plan is and the beds haven't been touched since then. I checked out the beds in mid-November. Several of the Louisianas and Spurias are still thriving as the ground was too hard to dig most of them out. Thank you Dara for what you were able to salvage. Since the beds haven't been touched, I think it is safe to leave them there for now as they are thriving.

SLI-SPURIA CONVENTION COMES TO DALLAS AREA



The Iris Society of Dallas will host the SLI-Spuria Convention April 26-28. This is the first ever joint Louisiana and Spuria iris Convention, but these bloomed at the same time during the national last year in Texas.

The registration deadline is March 25, 2024. Fairfield Inn and Suites by Marriott at 351 Market Center Drive in Terrell, which is east of Dallas, will serve as headquarters for this event that is surrounded by fast food restaurants like Chili's, Olive Garden, Texas Roadhouse, and Chuy's Mexican Food.
