

NEW HORTICULTURE RULES FOR ISA SHOW OF 2017

A Other Tall Bearded (TB) (not historic, SA or novelty)	K Aril Iris & Arilbred (AR & AB)
B Space Age TB (<i>introduced 1988 or later</i>)	L Spuria (SPU)
C Other Novelty TB (<i>non SA introduced 1988 or later</i>)	M Species & Species Crosses (SPEC & SPX)
D Historic TB (<i>introduced before 1988</i>)	N Bulbous
E Border Bearded (BB)	P Louisiana (LA)
F Intermediate Bearded (IB)	Q Japanese (JI)
G Miniature Tall Bearded (MTB)	R Other
H Standard Dwarf Bearded (SDB)	S Collection (<i>3 stalks, same variety or different</i>)
J Miniature Dwarf Bearded (MDB)	T English Box

NOT TALL BEADED

If your iris is anything other than a Tall Bearded, you must enter it in its general classification in Sections E – R. Sections A – D are for Tall Bearded Iris ONLY

TALL BEARDED

If your iris is Tall Bearded, then there are 4 possible Sections, and the following rules will tell you which is the one and only section you may enter it in

- 1 – Was it introduced before 1988?
 - 1A – If yes, then your only option is Historic TB – Section D
 - 1B – If no, continue to step 2
- 2 – Does your non-historic iris have the horns, spoons or flounces of a Space Age Iris?
 - 2A – If yes then your only option is Space Age TB – Section B
 - 2B – If no, continue to step 3
- 3 – Does your non-historic, non-space age iris have other novelty characteristics, like broken color or a flat form?
 - 3A – If yes then your only option is Other Novelty TB – Section C
 - 3B – If no, continue to step 4
- 4 – If you get to this step then your iris must be introduced 1988 or later, is not a space age iris, and does not have any other novelty characteristics. Correct?
 - 4A – If correct then your only option is Other TB – Section A
 - 4B – If no, you messed up somewhere, start again!
