

SAYS:

When cleaning up your Iris beds : spent blooms and stalks should be cut off close to the rhizome. Cut at an angle to avoid water soaking into the stub. This will help prevent rotting of the stub. Also use Dusting Sulfur as an aid in drying the cut stub.

The New Braunfels Iris Society held their 23rd IRIS SHOW April 25th at St. John's Episcopal Parish Hall in New Braunfels, Texas.

There were 144 Horticultural entries and 10 Artistic Design entries.

The AIS SILVER MEDAL was awarded to DR. W. CLYDE IKINS for winning the most BLUE RIBBONS.

The A I S BRONZE MEDAL was awarded to MR. KENNETH TRISCH for winning the second greatest number of BLUE RIBBONS.

The BEST SPECIMEN IN SHOW was awarded to SKATING PARTY, a large WHITE ruffled T. B. hybridized and introduced in 1983 by LARRY GAULTER This beauty was grown and exhibited

by DR. W. CLYDE IKINS . DR. IKINS received the A I S PURPLE ROSETTE RIBBON .

RUNNER-UP was awarded to LACED JABOT, a lovely, lacy LAVENDER T.B. Also hybridized and introduced by LARRY GAULTER in 1983. This lovely was grown and exhibited by MRS. MARY SMITH. MRS. SMITH received the SPECIAL AWARD ROSETTE RIBBON.

The AGNES ALTGELT AWARD, which is given to the BEST SPECIMEN as exhibited by a member of N B I S was awarded to DR. IKINS for his specimen of SKATING PARTY.

The ISABEL DAY AWARD, given for the BEST WHITE specimen, also went to DR. IKINS specimen of SKATING PARTY.

The SPECIAL AWARD ROSETTE for BEST BLUE was given to AFTER HOURS a ruffled, deep rich blue self with blue beards. This lovely T.B. was hybridized by DUANE MEEKS and introduced in 1981. It was grown and exhibited by MR. and MRS. RAYMOND DRAGON.

The SPECIAL AWARD ROSETTE for BEST YELLOW was given to TRAVEL ON a heavily laced golden yellow T. B. An oldie but goodie hybridized and introduced by NEVA SEXTON in 1969 It was grown and exhibited by MR. and MRS. RAYMOND DRAGON.

The SPECIAL AWARD ROSETTE for BEST PLICATA went to JESSE'S SONG a fantastic blue and violet T. B. with blue/white tipped lemon beards. It was hybridized and introduced by BRYCE WILLIAMSON in 1979. It was grown and exhibited by DR. W. CLYDE IKINS.

The SPECIAL AWARD ROSETTE for the BEST BI - COLOR was given to MICHIGAN PRIDE, a brassy gold and maroon T. B. It was hybridized and introduced by TENA BERNDT in 1976 It was grown and exhibited by DR. IKINS.

The SPECIAL AWARD ROSETTE for the BEST RED(pale, ight or full) was given to UANITY, a lovely soft pink T. B. It was hybridized and introduced by BEN HAGER in 1974. It was grown and exhibited by JOANNE DOWNING.

The SPECIAL AWARD ROSETTE for the BEST SPURIA was given to MEGATREND. A stately Spuria with Violet/white (S) and yellow/white (F). Hybridized and introduced by BEN HAGER in 1987. It was grown and exhibited by MRS. CECIL (ELLENE) ROCKWELL.

The SPECIAL AWARD ROSETTE for the BEST LOUISIANA was given to MARY'S CHOICE. Plum-red with yellow signal and slighty ruffled falls. It was hybridized and introduced by MARY DUNN IN 1981. It was grown and exhibited by DR. W. CLYDE IKINS.

The SPECIAL AWARD ROSETTE for the BEST COLLECTION was given to IMPERIAL BRONZE. A vivid yellow Spuria with deep bronze overlay. It was hybridized and introduced by ELEANOR McCOWN in 1970. The Collection was grown and exhibited by THE SCHAEFERS.

The SPECIAL AWARD ROSETTE for the BEST SEEDLING was given to JAMES ALLEN for HIS lovely ruffled blue T.B. hybrid, (S11K). THE ARTISTIC DESIGN section had 10 arrangements. Three of these were in the MEN'S section and seven were in the LADIES' section.

JAMES ALLEN won the BLUE RIBBON in the MEN'S section for his arrangement entitled "THE SNOWS OF MT. FUJI".

MRS. MARTIN (ROSE MARIE)
DEAN was awarded the BLUE RIBBON
in the LADIES' section for her
lovely arrangement of Iris.
