IRIS MEETING TO FOLLOW JUDGES TRAINING JAN. 6

Registration for Judges Training will begin at 8:30 A.M. Saturday, January 6, in the Zilker Botanical Garden Auditorium, 2220 Barton Springs Road.

Peggy Lamb will conduct the educational phase from 9 A.M. until noon.

According to Gordon Green, Judges Training Chairman in Region 17, five new people who attended the convention in Dallas indicated that they would become student judges. He reminded all the new candidates that they must be AIS members for three years by the time their training is complete. Each person received a packet with requirements to complete the apprenticeship. AIS will start requiring a set amount of hours for garden judging every year for every judge, but this training will be offered at each National Convention.

A \$5 fee will be collected during registration, but this training is fun, educational, and valuable to iris society members. Judges are always needed, and this is a great opportunity to start training.

Lunch will follow the training session, and the iris meeting will begin about 12:30 P.M.

Subcommittees will be forming soon such as the hospitality committee and bus captains.


The committee did decide to have a boutique at the convention and are looking for vendors to sell goods at the boutique.
